## New Exhibit - Expedition: Arctic

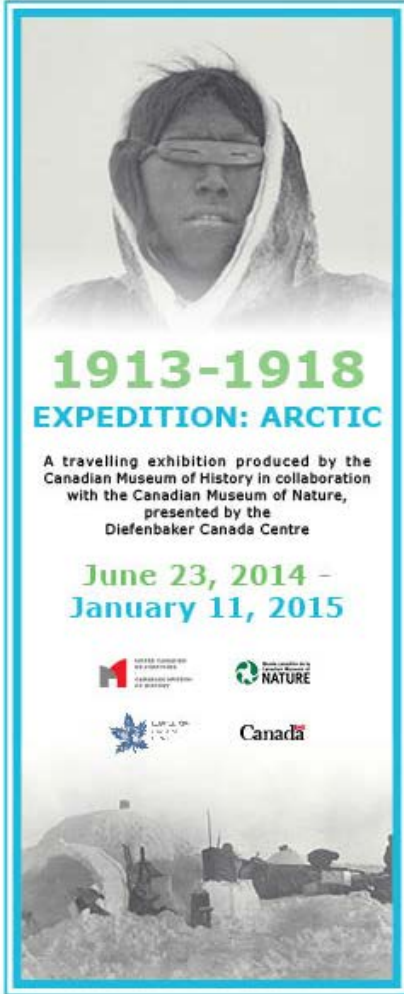
"The Diefenbaker Canada Centre is currently hosting an exhibit from the Canadian Museum of History and the Canadian Museum of

Nature. 'Expedition: Arctic' revisits the triumphs and tragedies of the Canadian Arctic Expedition of 1913–1918, which claimed the lives of 17 men—most lost to exposure, mishap or starvation—but which also added immensely to our understanding of Canada's Western Arctic and the cultures of its First Peoples. In addition, the Expedition, sponsored by the federal government, expanded and defended Canada's Arctic sovereignty.

Visitors are offered a chance to 'become' one of the many members of the Expedition and imagine its hardships and successes; discover the travel technologies of the day; experience life in the camps; and learn about the immense, lasting contribution to our understanding of the Arctic. "Expedition: Arctic" will be on display at the DCC until January 11, 2015.
